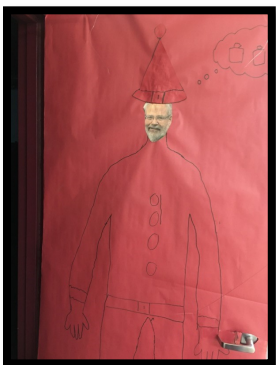

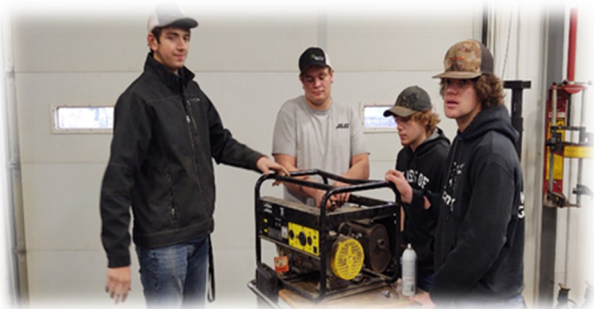
DECA members spread some holiday cheer this season! They spent some time making handmade Christmas ornaments that were delivered to residents at Oakes Good Sam Society.

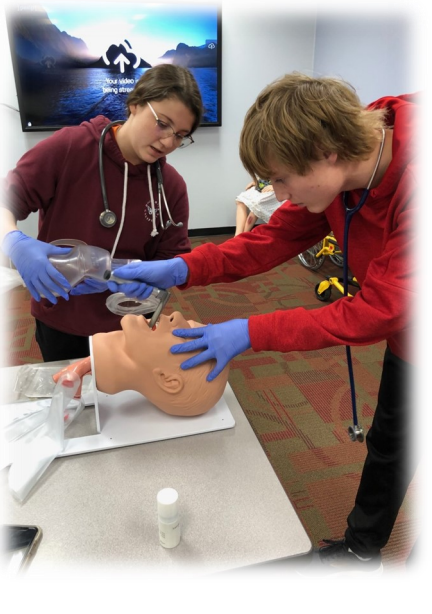
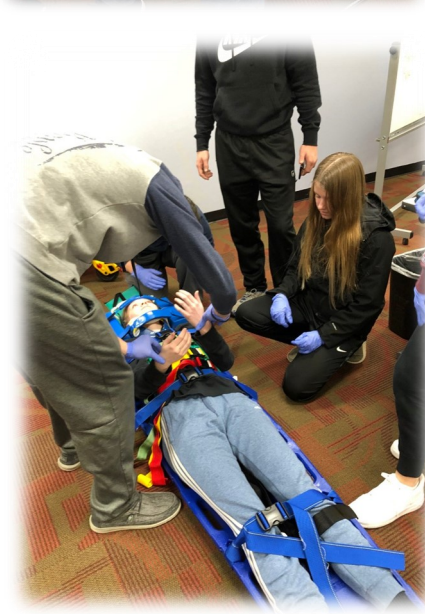
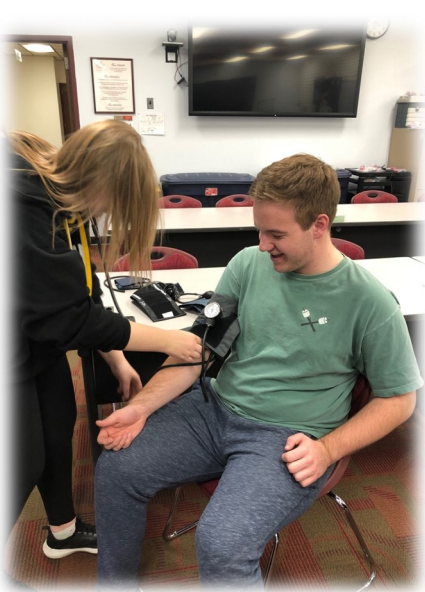
EMT/ADVANCED EMT/PCT

The cooler weather is a reminder of some “COOL” medical interventions the EMT/Advanced EMT/PCT students have been implementing over the past several weeks.

EMT students became knowledgeable of obtaining vital signs including locating various pulse sights. They also learned proper technique of obtaining blood pressures via auscultation and palpation methods. Students gained an understanding of when to apply supplemental oxygen, using the correct oxygenation devices for patients. EMT students also just completed skills of cervical spinal immobilization, implementing neurological assessments and rapid trauma assessment skills.

Advanced students have been learning about advanced airway, recently completing endotracheal tube intubation skills using airway manikins. Advanced students also finished the semester gaining knowledge of electrocardiogram (ECG) interpretation. Students learned the importance of identifying ectopic or abnormal heart rhythms along with recognizing normal sinus rhythm versus atrial fibrillation and life threatening arrhythmias such as ventricular fibrillation. Lastly, students performed EKG's on one another, applying their knowledge to the practical aspect. All students have enjoyed applying critical thinking skills when faced with “real-life” ambulance scenarios; this has proven to challenge students, to engage and encourage their creativity in coordinating patient care.
