North Sargent Greenhouse Becoming a Reality By Dan Rood, Jr., Director

The North Sargent Public School, in cooperation with the Southeast Region Career and Technology Center, has been working on a plan for the construction of a greenhouse that will enhance learning opportunities for students enrolled in the Agriculture Program. It will also provide cooperative learning projects with students in science classes and provide a hands-on component for elementary students and teachers with their science plant lessons. Supt. Dawn Hoeke and the North Sargent School Board embarked on a fundraising plan to build a greenhouse, which was given a huge boost by obtaining a Perkins V Grant through the North Dakota State Department for Career and Technology Education coupled with a matching grant donation from North Dakota Farmers Union. The Southeast Region Career and Technology Center is providing technical and construction assistance and funding for internal equipment, tables, lighting, benching, control systems and general operations.

The greenhouse is in the process of being built on the northwest corner of the Agriculture Education lab at North Sargent High School by Albert J. Lauer Greenhouse Company from Farmington, Minnesota. This is the eighth greenhouse that SRCTC has been involved with and joins other affiliated greenhouses in Oakes, Lisbon, Lidgerwood, Wyndmere, Colfax, and two in Wahpeton. Albert J. Lauer is a renowned builder of quality greenhouses and have done many of the research greenhouses at NDSU in Fargo. This greenhouse will have state of the art technology including an integrated weather station that will control lighting and venting, in-floor heat, LED grow lights, computerized watering and environmental controls and an automated heat and sunshade system. This facility will provide students the opportunity to learn with the latest greenhouse equipment available and provide new botany and horticulture course options. Within the greenhouse environment, additional courses will open many doors for students (from both farming and non-farming families) by giving them the opportunity to learn how to plant, fertilize, maintain and harvest crops and ornamentals throughout the year, plant science research, community and public flower and ornamental projects and hopefully be a main lead for school beautification projects. Collaborating with North Dakota Farmers Union will lead to real world research opportunities to grow, nurture and collect data on plant production while learning to conduct cost benefit analysis of crops produced.

The greenhouse will allow for plant growth and production year round, as it is a completely climate-controlled environment. The greenhouse will also allow for the integration of aquaponics (growing fish and plants together in a symbiotic system) into the curriculum.

A huge research project is planned along with the North Dakota Farmers Union, Mr. Zetocha and his students on research relating to growing different types of plants that can be raised for human consumption and incorporated into their restaurants in Washington D.C., Maryland, Virginia and Pennsylvania such as herbs, mushrooms, specialty foods and spices. "It will be a fantastic thing when a Washington D.C. restaurant serves food items with a direct connection to the North Sargent School, SRCTC and Gwinner community that all revolve around teaching and learning Agriculture connected to specialty horticulture instruction in a rural setting!" according to Kris Beck, NS School Board Chair and Southeast Region CTC Board Representative.


